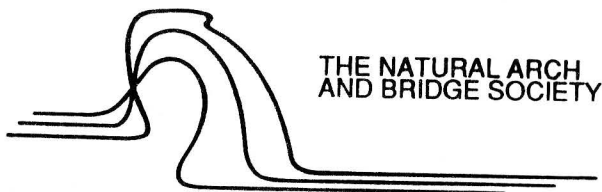
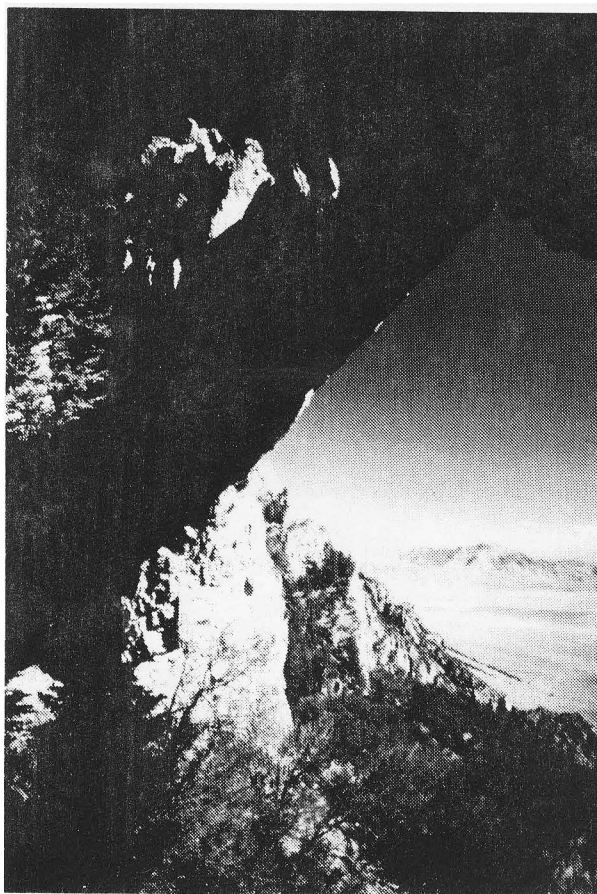




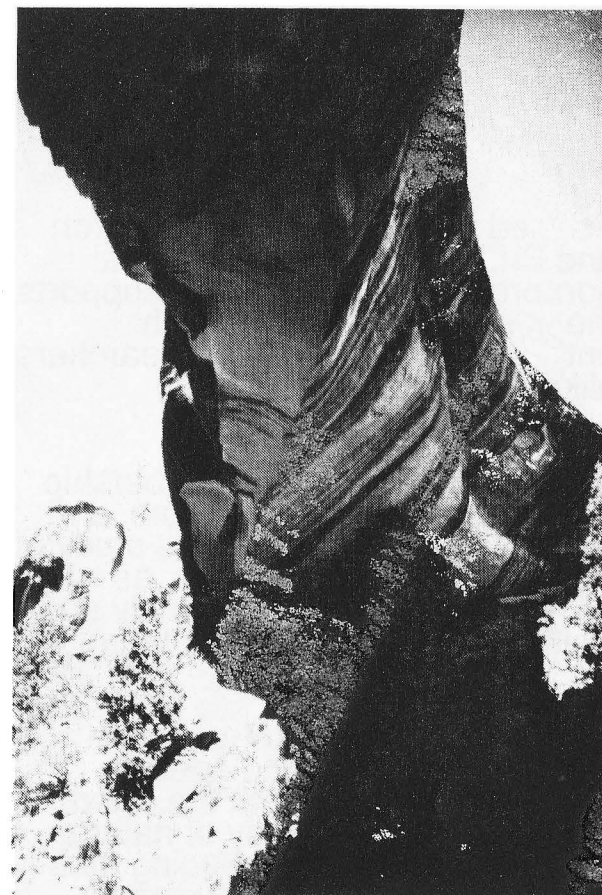

Snake Bridge, New Mexico

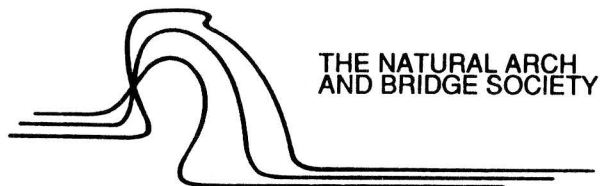

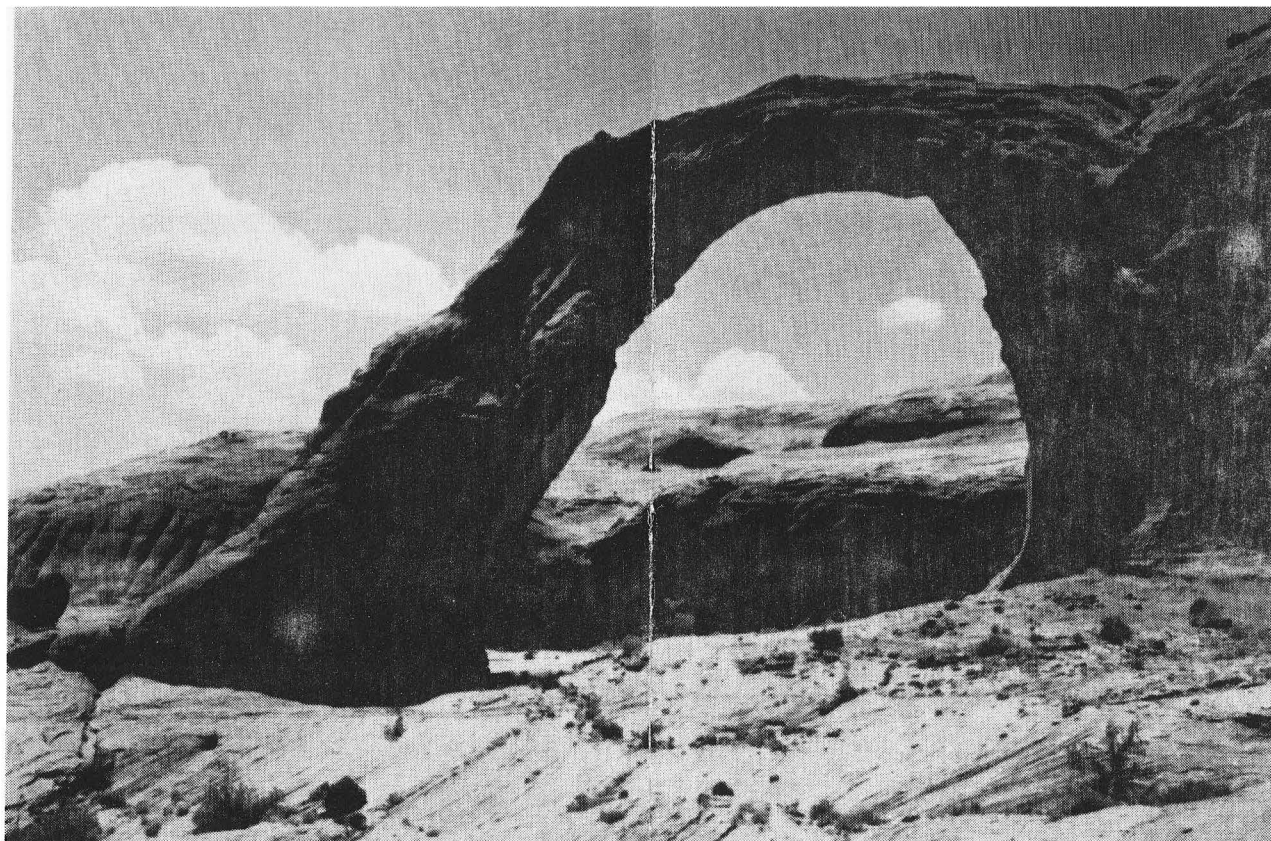
THE NATURAL ARCH
